Soo Young Rieh is an Associate Professor in the School of Information at the University of Michigan where she is the Program Director of the Masters of Science in Information (MSI). Rieh's research investigates information behavior and human information interaction, focusing on how people assess information credibility and quality in the process of information seeking. In recent years, her research interests have expanded to searching as learning, social search, and information literacy. Her research projects have been funded by the MacArthur Foundation and the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). Rieh is currently serving as a member of the Editorial Board for Journal of the Association for Information Science and Technology (JASIST) and Library and Information Science Research. She co-edited the Journal of Information Science Special Issue on Searching as Learning in 2016. She is a past chair of the ASIS&T Special Interest Group in Information Needs Seeking and Use (SIGUSE), a co-chair of the ASIS&T Awards and Honors Committee in 2015-2017, and a co-chair of the iSchool Dissertation Award in 2016-2017. She is a recipient of several research awards, including the Best JASIST Paper Award (2011, 2005), the ASIST Best Conference Paper Award (2010), the ASIST SIGUSE Award for Best Information Behavior Conference Paper (2007, 2015), the Eugene Garfield-ALISE Doctoral Dissertation Award (2002). Before joining the Michigan faculty in 2002, Rieh worked as a human factors research engineer at Excite@Home Search and Directory Group. She received her Ph.D. in communication, information, and library studies from Rutgers University, U.S.A.

Marcin Roszkowski Associate Professor at the University of Warsaw, in the Department of Journalism, Information and Book Studies at the University of Warsaw, Poland, a major academic centre for library studies in Poland. He holds a Master degree in Library & Information Science from the Jagiellonian University (Cracow). His thesis topic was about the concept of relevance in information retrieval. He holds a Ph.D. from the Silesia University (Poland) on using indexing language as a tool for information access and organization in networked environment. He is currently focusing his research and teaching on formal models of bibliographic universe under the perspective of the Semantic Web

technologies. This includes bibliographic ontologies, metadata standards, controlled vocabularies and Library Linked Data. He is currently working on the concept of "bibliographic universe" represented in metadata schemes and web ontologies

Magdalena Shishenkova, M.L.I.S. works as research associate (monitor) in the field of clinical observational research. Having graduated Information Science in Université de Montréal, she is now a Ph.D. candidate at Université de Lille 3.
